The following achievements are **required** to earn Idaho Conference recognition for Outstanding TLT. The Service Project Application form is due at Biblefest (first Sabbath in November). The Service Project Application may also be submitted by camp meeting so that TLTs can work on Service Projects during the summer. Please note the approval process on the Service Project Application form.

This completed form, along with the signed Service Project Summary, is to be turned into your Pathfinder Club Director by March 15. A copy of the completed form and Service Project Summary is due at the conference office by April 1.

Summary may be typed or neatly handwritten.

Answer the following questions in essay format—minimum 200 words.

- A. Describe your project.
- B. Describe the steps you used to do this project.
- C. How did you feel when you did this project? (Include how you felt planning it, doing it, and how you felt when it was completed.) What was the hardest part for you?
- D. How do you think others felt about your project (club members, family members, those it may have benefited)?
- E. Would you do this project again? If not, what other project would you consider doing?

- 2. Service Project Summary: Due to your club director by March 15.
- 3. Signed Outstanding TLT Recognition form: Due to your club director by March 15.
- 4. Your club director will submit both items to the Idaho Conference office by April 1.

Service for Others Project Suggestions and Requirements

The Service Project for Others requires long—range planning.

Choose a service project that will interest you.

In selecting a project, a minimum number of hours according to Pathways level must go into the planning, implementation, and reporting. Be sure to allow adequate time for each phase.

This is a personal project, not a club project. You cannot be paid for your project.

Bring 3 copies of your Service Project Application (and your club director) to your interview at Biblefest. Your Service Project Summary must be submitted to your club director by March 15, along with the completed and signed Outstanding Pathfinder Recognition form. Your club director will submit both items to the conference by April 1.

Suggested Projects (but not limited to):

- Fund raising for worthy projects (never for self)
- Assisting in Sabbath School department
- Temperance talks/skits to younger children
- Tutoring younger students at school
- Free yard care/housework for elderly person or disabled person
- Have story hours
- Hold a church office
- Do volunteer work in a hospital
- Landscaping public building or church/park
- Develop nature trails
- Plant trees
- Maintain literature racks
- Provide books, games, etc. to hospitals
- Help church with mailings/ mailing lists
- Create posters/art projects for hospitals
- Prepare Christmas stockings for orphans/hospitalized children
- Plan vespers program for church
- Assist with food or clothing distribution
